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## Health related topics

Course Title	Course details
Autism awareness	There are a number of e-learning modules available using the following link:-

Dementia Awareness for Care Staff	This ½ day <b>face to face</b> Dementia Awareness workshop is specifically for those working in the care sector and has been designed to ensure staff have sufficient knowledge and skills to provide high-quality, appropriate, compassionate dementia care.
Dementia Bus - Virtual Dementia Tour	The Virtual Dementia Tour (VDT) gives delegates an experience of what dementia might be like by using specialist equipment and creating a simulated environment. Delegates will be expected to carry out simple tasks during the tour and will be able to empathise with challenges that people living with dementia may experience. Delivered in a mobile simulator (vehicle), each <b>face to face</b> Virtual Dementia Tour session lasts for three hours. Three delegates at a time will spend 10 minutes on the bus, before attending the de-brief and training session afterwards.
Dementia Friends Awareness	This 1-hour <b>face to face</b> awareness session will inspire delegates to become a Dementia Friend, therefore committing to an action that will make the lives of people living with dementia a little better. You will leave the session with a Dementia Friend's badge which you can wear to highlight your support to those living with dementia.
Dementia – see me, hear me, support me.	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> session will encourage participants to discuss supporting those living with dementia ensuring individuals are seen, heard and supported in a person-centred way. Participant are encouraged to have completed the Dementia Awareness session before attending this session.
Dementia Interpreter Course	This 3-hour interactive <b>face to face</b> course will help you to appreciate what it is like to lose verbal communication and the challenges around this. People living with dementia face changes and challenges in communication as the disease progresses. It can be common that the person loses the ability to speak as they would before the disease. When this happens, the brain seeks new ways to communicate. This might be through actions, noises, behaviours and

	body language. This can be called the language of dementia. A Dementia Interpreter is someone who helps translate actions, noises, behaviours and body language into an understandable and recognised language.
Dining Immersive Experiential Training (DIET)	DIET is a <b>face to face</b> training course that combines experiential elements, classroom learning and group discussions to help learners to understand some of the difficulties people with dementia might experience around mealtimes. As a participant in DIET, you will explore various
Dementia Training	factors that could influence food and fluid intake, both positive and negative, and discover ways of supporting people to eat and drink.
	DIET is all about increasing understanding and looking at new ways to support people with the goal of increasing food and fluid intake and to better lives.
Epilepsy & Rescue Medication	The 2-hour <b>online</b> training aims to provide participants with information about Epilepsy, the causes, the types and seizure classification. For the online course reading materials with links to NICE guidelines with the skills and assessment forms will be sent out usually about a week prior to the course. The course is interactive and staff will need to read the materials before training.
Food Safety Awareness	This <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> day <b>online</b> course is intended for staff in social care settings who undertake light food preparation activities. This course offers some basic awareness of food safety.
Food Hygiene Level 2	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> course is intended for food handlers in social care settings who prepare and handle high risk open (unwrapped) foods. Subjects covered include hazards and controls, food safety management and temperature controls, and the role of the food handler in keeping food safe.
Health & Well-being: top to toe	This ½ day <b>face to face</b> course aims to support care workers to understand the needs of individuals in their care, from their heads to their toes. The course is closely linked to units within the Health & Social Care Level 2 & 3 Core and Practice Qualification and has clear outcomes focussed on oral health and mouth care; nutrition and hydration; foot care; pressure

	area care; personal care and continence management in terms of the link between inadequate health and well-being and safeguarding.
ICAN Mental Health and Suicide Awareness Training	This 3-hour <b>online</b> awareness course will provide an understanding of suicide and focuses on the skills needed to help a person at risk of or threatening suicide.
Infection Control	This e-learning module is available for all staff through the following link:- <u>https://socialcare.wales/learning-modules/sound-knowledge-understanding-and-application-of-infection-prevention-and-control</u>
Medication	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> course covers issues relating to safe handling of medication including receipt, storage and disposing of medication by social care staff providing direct care. It may also include monitoring dosage systems as well as other related topics.
Medication refresher	This ½ day <b>face to face</b> course offers those who have already undertaken the full day course, an opportunity to refresh their knowledge and practice after a 3-year period. The course covers issues relating to safe handling of medication including receipt, storage and disposing of medication by social care staff providing direct care.
Mental Health – Depression, anxiety and personality disorder.	This 1-day <b>online</b> training aims to introduce the main issues which arise when working with or caring for someone who is experiencing common mental health issues, such as depression and anxiety and also those diagnosed with a personality disorder. The course will look at the nature of the most commonly diagnosed conditions and also explore the complexity of Personality Disorders, including Borderline Personality Disorder (BPD) and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) disorders amongst others.
Mental Health – Anxiety Management	This 3-hour face to face session has been developed to support staff working across social care in order that they are able to recognise signs of stress in themselves and others and have an awareness of how to deal with this.
Mental Health – Stress Management	This 3-hour face to face session has been developed to support staff working across social care in order that they are able to recognise signs of stress in themselves and others and have an awareness of how to deal with this.

Moving & Positioning Passport (2 day)	This 2-day <b>face to face</b> training course is designed to meet the needs of Flintshire direct care staff and is based on the All Wales NHS and Local Government Manual Handling Training Passport and Information Scheme. Upon completion of the course all participants will have a good understanding of the All-Wales Manual Handling Passport scheme, therefore ensuring that skills are consistent across Wales.
Moving & Positioning Refresher	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> refresher course reviews and summarises learning and practice regarding inanimate load handling; sitting, standing, walking; bed mobility; lateral transfers; and hoisting. Direct care staff who need to maintain their Moving and Positioning Passport are required to complete the 1-day refresher course every 3 years. Staff who have been unable to complete the refresher within the 3-year timescale are required to re-take the 2-day Moving and Positioning Passport course.
Moving & Positioning Train the Trainer (TTT)	This 3-day <b>face to face</b> course will enable participants to have the skills and knowledge to train their own staff all the requirements of the Moving and Positioning 2-day Passport.
Paediatric First Aid	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> emergency first aid training for medical emergencies, relevant to those working with children up to the age of 16.
Palliative care and end of life training	This 1-day <b>face-to-face</b> course covers the aspects of palliative and end of life care, which are important for direct care staff to be aware of. On completion of training, successful candidates should be able to understand the difference between Palliative and End of Life Care; the importance of communication and knowing what matters to the individual.
Substance Misuse – Young People	This 2-hour <b>online</b> workshop aims to provide participants with information relating to substance misuse and young people within Flintshire.
Suicide awareness	Free training is available via https://zerosuicidealliance.com/
Versus Arthritis training	This 1-hour <b>online</b> session is designed for anyone who comes into contact with individuals living with Arthritis or other Musculoskeletal conditions, or for those who are interested in broadening their knowledge of these conditions.

It challenges closed culture working and ensures that staff have a thorough understanding of an individual's legal rights and staff legal obligations.
Mental Health Act (including role of AMPH)	The 1-day <b>online</b> course aims to develop and enhance knowledge and understanding of non- specialist practitioners in relation to the Mental Health Act. Understanding the main legislation relevant to Mental Health Law, together with the functions and powers contained in key sections of the Mental Health Act are key components of this training. The course also helps participants to understand the role of the Approved Mental Health Practitioner (AMHP).

## Practice Support and Development

Building Stronger Families: IFSS training	The 3-day course <b>face to face</b> has been designed to provide training in our evidence-based intervention when working with Prochaska and DiClemente Cycle of Change. It is envisaged that practitioners will be able to select elements of the IFSS model or utilise the whole intervention to enhance their own practice. IFSS provide family focused interventions using a researched and well evidenced model of proven efficacy to focus on a family's values, beliefs and highlight their strengths and resources.
Case Conference and Core Groups multi-agency practice workshops	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> practice workshop aims to offer practitioners a chance to revisit, review and reboot their knowledge and understanding around participating in a Child Protection Case Conference and subsequent Core Groups in Flintshire. The course prepares you for your participation, explains the reasons for a conference, its purpose, and the role of participants. It sets out what you can expect in the conference itself, taking you through the conference process right through to decision making. The afternoon then focusses on Core groups, their purpose, roles and responsibilities and timescales.
Chronologies practice workshop	This 3-hour <b>face to face</b> workshop aims to offer practitioners a chance to revisit, review and reboot their knowledge and understanding around the purpose of chronologies within Safeguarding processes. The session will support with understanding around the importance of chronologies as part of the assessment process; how it should support the analysis of risks; and who is responsible for them. The workshops are both interactive and informative in order to support practitioners to feel more confident in terms of what a good chronology looks like and how to create one.
Coaching & Mentoring	This 1-day <b>online</b> course is aimed at those with management/ supervisory responsibilities in order to build coaching and mentoring skills, learn new skills and create new behaviours to support their teams and personal career progression. It will support candidates to

	understand how to develop personal competencies and how not to develop unhealthy dependencies for the effective coaching relationship. It will offer information on how to develop objective measures to track effectiveness, develop awareness and responsibility in the coachee and boost morale and transform toxic attitudes into positive ones.
Compassion fatigue, moral injury and supporting resilience	This 1-day <b>online</b> workshop aims to increase awareness of compassion fatigue and moral Injury and how these affect practitioners in social care settings. This course focuses on the impact of working in high intensity, emotionally impactful working environments on practitioners. It considers trauma informed practice in relation to practitioners and how they can maintain resilience within chaotic work settings. The day provides a foundation for taking active measures in maintaining resilience and self- care whilst considering the impact of the pandemic alongside working in settings that are demanding and quick changing.
Compassionate Leadership	This 1-day <b>online</b> training will introduce the concept of Compassionate Leadership. For many years people have seen leadership as someone who give orders and others follow. However, things have changed, and we now know that to get the best out of people we need to work together, show respect and be kind. We recognise that there are a wide range of resources which describe compassionate and inclusive cultures across a range of sectors.
Conversational Skills	This 1-day <b>online</b> course will enable participants to improve their conversational skills. The course is aimed at any professional working with and supporting children, families and older people. The course will explore professional curiosity, disguised compliance and how to handle difficult conversations as well as improving general communication skills.
De-escalation Techniques	This 1-day <b>face to face</b> training for care staff will support and build on their knowledge of de- escalating situations using verbal techniques, distraction and pattern interrupters. Discussions will include how we manage our own behaviours and responses to escalating situations and the importance of post-incident support.

Leadership and Management Programme	This 4-day <b>face to face</b> programme focusses on leadership and management and improving efficiency and effectiveness. This 4-day programme will offer attendees a practical toolkit for leading and managing now and in the future. <b>ATTENDANCE ON ALL 4 DAYS IS ESSENTIAL.</b>
Person Centred Care	This ½ day <b>online</b> session explains and explores why providing personalised care to each individual is important. This session reviews the principles of Person-Centred Care as well as exploring the 6 C's of the Person-Centred care/approach, with an overview of the legislation such as The Care Act and the Social Services and Wellbeing Act Wales. The session supports staff to understand how to deliver personalised care in their day-to-day work; with lots of practical activities to engage staff and promote their learning.
Professional Boundaries, Curiosity and Accountability	This 1-day, <b>face to face</b> course is designed as an induction day to explore and develop the task of the support worker specifically in relation to professional behaviour, professional curiosity, and appropriate boundaries in the relationships with individuals receiving support and also the accountabilities placed on the staff member.
Reflective Practice	This ½ day <b>online</b> course on reflective practice is useful for all staff. Working in health and social care can be stressful, this course gives staff the tools in theory and practice to reflect constructively on their work, both individually and as part of a team.

## Safeguarding

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Ask & Act - VAWDASV	This ½ day <b>online</b> course discusses "Ask and Act" as a Welsh Government policy of targeted enquiry. The term targeted enquiry describes the recognition of indicators of violence against women, domestic abuse and sexual violence as a prompt for a professional to ask their client whether they have been affected by any of these issues. It is the role of the entire Public Service to provide an effective response to those experiencing violence against women, domestic abuse and sexual violence.
Child Sexual Exploitation	This 2-hour <b>online</b> session gives an awareness of how child sexual exploitation can happen, what the risks to children and young people are, and what action can be taken, incorporating emerging themes such as county lines and criminal exploitation.
Missing from Care	This 1-day, <b>face to face</b> course considers what is meant by the term 'missing from care', considers the different 'opportunities' when young people may be more likely to go missing, the reasons why and states the procedure which all organisations need to follow for dealing with this situation. The course aims to support practitioners to consider the process for planning when a young person is found and will be returning to their care and how the role of an 'appropriate adult' may relate to cases of missing children and young people. The training also offers the opportunity to consider how organisations must ensure confidentiality and data protection is maintained and how to deal with issues including working with the police and dealing with enquiries from the press.
Neglect: Improving outcomes for children	This ½-day <b>face to face</b> workshop provides a critical overview of Neglect in relation to Safeguarding Children and aims to support professionals to effectively safeguard children. The session will explore legislation relating to Neglect; develop an understanding of what neglect is; recognise the impact of neglect and how to appropriately respond to concerns.
Oxford Brain Story	The ½-day <b>face to face</b> training demonstrates how the Oxford Brain Story (OBS) is a framework that shares key scientific knowledge with the aim of building resilience in young children, families and communities.
